Internet Explorer 7 Tip

For the most part, when you visit websites, a "User Agent String" is sent from your browser to the website so it recognizes which browser, and to some extent, operating system, you are running. This way websites can display alternate versions optimized for specific web browsers or warn you that the site will not run on the particular browser you are currently using.

It is possible that some websites will not function correctly when you visit them with Internet Explorer 7 as the sites may look for a User Agent String specifying version 6 of the web browser only.

To deal with this issue, Microsoft has released a utility that lets the Internet Explorer 7 web browser report itself as a previous version, making it possible to visit some of these older sites.

Buying a New Computer?

Below is a list of things you should do AS SOON as you buy a new computer.

1. **Emergency Disks**

Many CDs or DVDs are included with your computer for pre-installed software. Put these in a safe place for future usage - such as your computer crashing due to a virus. You may even want to make duplicates of these CDs and DVDs for added protection.

2. **Install Security Software**

Before connecting to the Internet, make sure you have installed Security Software and have a working Firewall. If your new computer was pre-installed with a Security Software that you will not be using, you may need to uninstall it prior to installing different software.

3. **Uninstall Software**

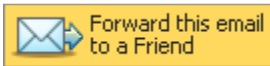
Most computers are loaded with software programs that you will never use, such as trial games, Internet Service Providers, photo applications, and many more. Go to "Add / Remove Programs" in the Control Panel and Remove any programs you will not be using. This will clean up hard drive space and can help your computer run faster.

4. **Consider a New Web Browser**

When using your new computer, you do not have to use the Default Internet Browser. There are many browsers available for surfing the web, such as Firefox, Google Chrome, Opera, and others.

5. **Update All Software**

Once you are online, immediately update your Operating system and any other FREE programs such as Adobe Flash, Java, QuickTime, and Real Player. Keeping these programs up to date will help reduce the risk of being infected with a virus.
